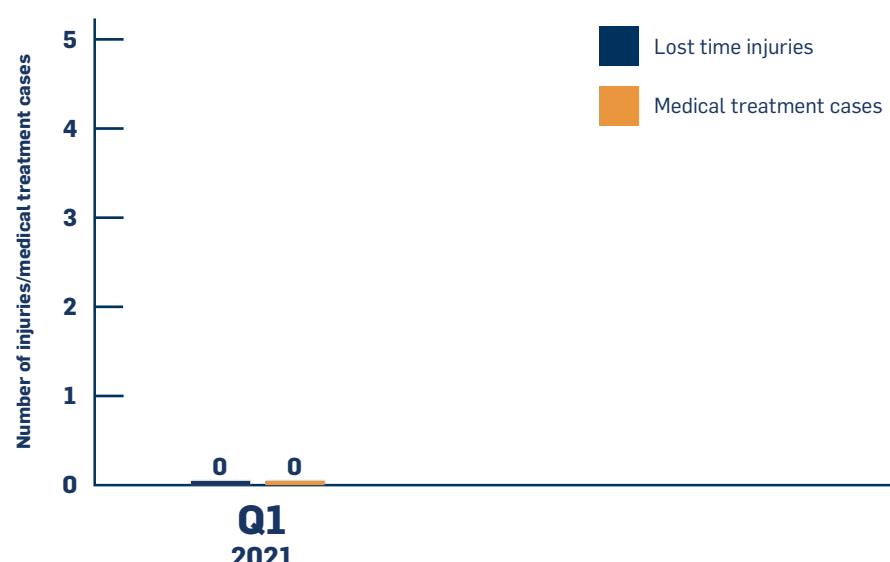

At Resolution Copper safety comes first.

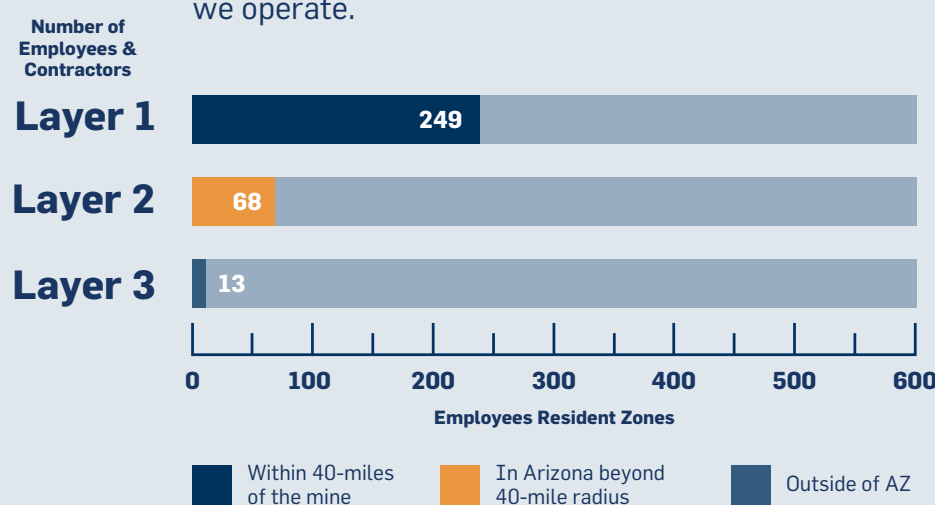

The Community Working Group (CWG) includes businesses, area leaders and local organizations interested in the project and committed to the community. The CWG meets monthly to discuss the latest project development, helping us stay connected with local citizens, understand their concerns, and make fully informed decisions. Also, CWG performs community water quality sampling alongside Resolution Copper. Here, the CWG collects quarterly groundwater and surface water samples from different points in the Queen Creek watershed for historical data.



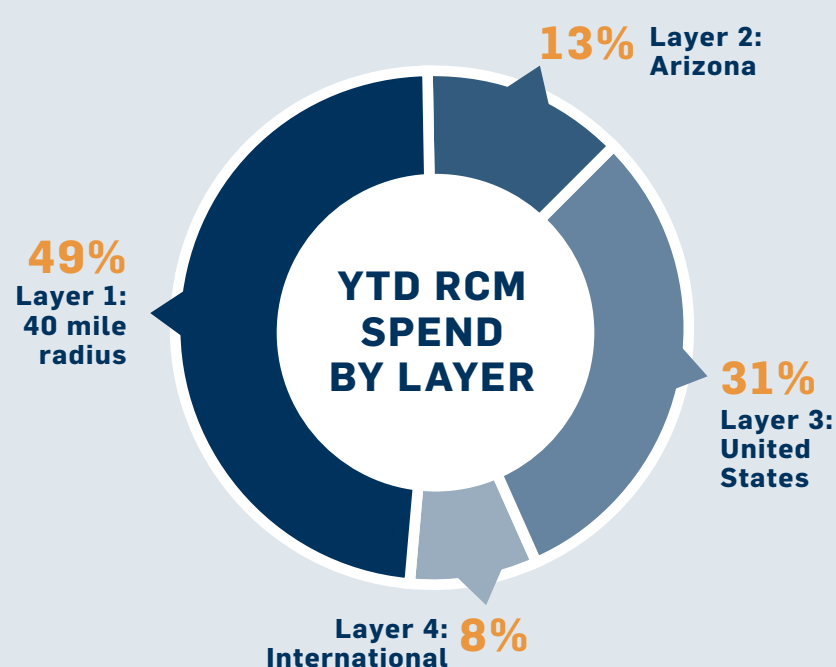

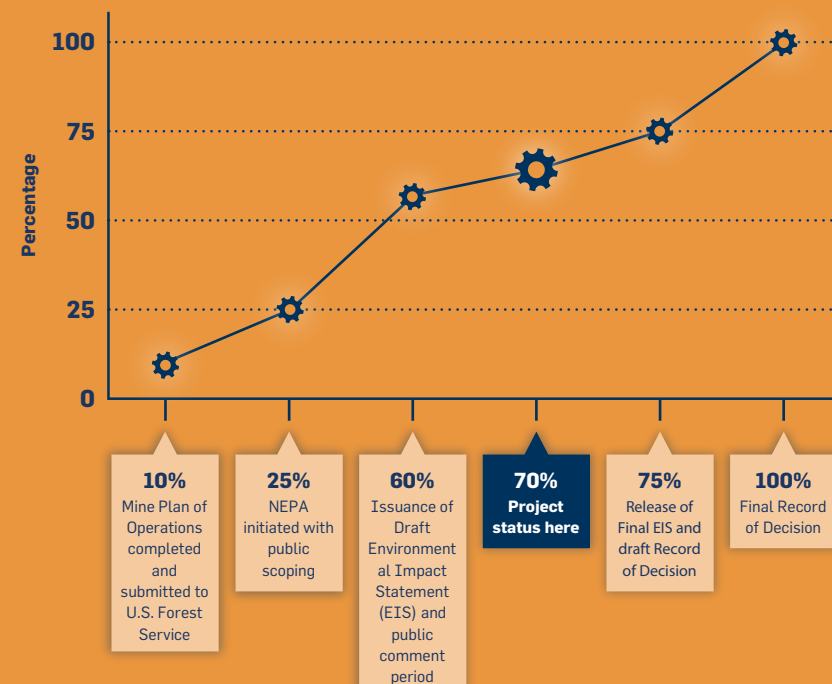


PERMITTING

In January, the US Forest Service (USFS) published the Final Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) after seven years of extensive public and tribal consultation. In March, the US Department of Agriculture directed the USFS to rescind the Final EIS to continue tribal consultation. The USFS did not give an exact length of time for completing the review of the consultation record; however, talks of this nature generally take several months. We remain committed to engaging with local communities and Native American Tribes throughout this process.

OVERALL PROGRESS IN FEDERAL PERMITTING PROCESS



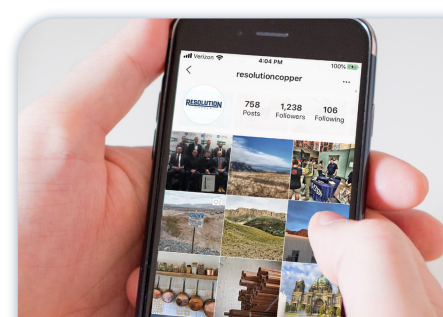
