



### PROTECTING THE ENVIRONMENT **AND OUR COMMUNITY**

Over the summer, the Copper Triangle was devastated by the Telegraph and Mescal wildfires and employees and contractors in our local community were personally impacted by this natural disaster. To make matters worse, monsoon season was especially destructive this year as burn-scarred terrain met heavy rainfall. In response, Resolution Copper facilitated donations to local charities, provided much-needed support to animal shelters and local ranchers, and coordinated clean-up efforts with local contractors.

We partnered with the Red Cross, Humane Society, and Superior Food Bank to donate basic necessities to evacuation centers in Globe-Miami, Mesa, and to the fire incident command center at Superior High School. We provided \$25,200 to the Gila County Cattle Growers Association as grazing conditions for local ranchers throughout the Copper Triangle communities and the San Carlos Apache reservation were decimated.

Resolution Copper provided essential geographic system information to the US Forest Service (USFS) to carry out controlled back burns to protect the Oak Flat campground and Emory Oak groves. We offered our resources, including buildings and stored water supply, to assist in the emergency response.

Despite having lost so much in the wildfires and severe flooding, our community continues to rebuild stronger than ever.










## PERMITTING AND CULTURAL HERITAGE

The Resolution Copper Tribal Monitor team has performed approximately 61,000 acres of pedestrian surveys to-date. The pioneer program was first created in 2018 to create an opportunity for community perspectives, ancestral ties to the proposed project area. The program is run by the US the affected tribes are part of the informed decision-making process American Tribes to work alongside third-party archaeologists. The Tribal Monitor Program has led to the preservation of hundreds of artifacts and Tribes.
