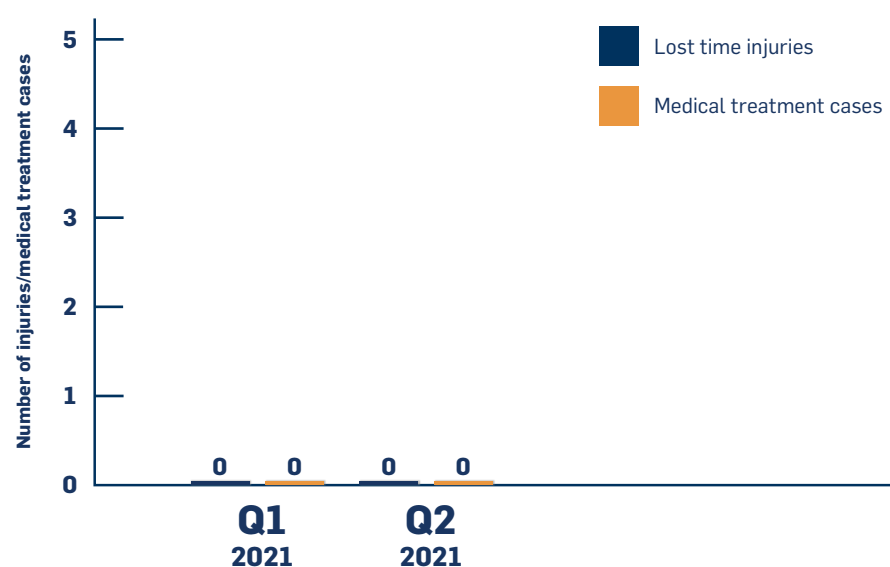

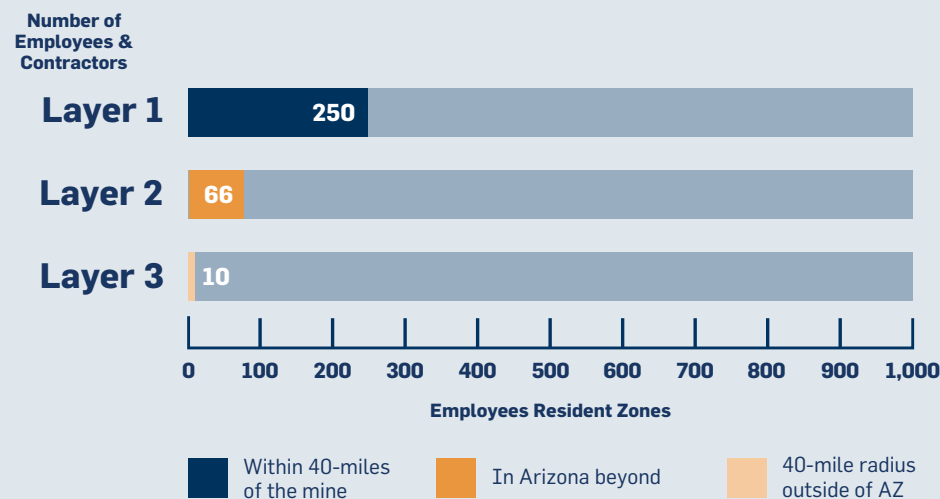

PROTECTING THE ENVIRONMENT

The Emory oak is an important resource to the Western Apache Tribal Nations. The acorns serve as a traditional food source, and the trees hold cultural significance, often being used in tribal ceremonies. In recent decades, Apache elders have noticed the health of these special trees declining. The Emory oak population has also been affected by drought, fire suppression, livestock grazing, groundwater reductions, species competition and climate change.

Resolution Copper is working to protect and preserve this unique species in our community. In the fall of 2018 we began a multi-year partnership with the US Forest Service (USFS), consulting with Western Apache tribes and Northern Arizona University to create the Emory Oak Collaborative Tribal Restorative Initiative (EOCTRI), a conservation program focused solely on restoring the Emory oak habitat. We have been informed and guided by tribal elders' traditional ecological knowledge, and along with essential new academic research funded by Resolution Copper, we are working together to ensure that these special trees are thriving for generations to come.

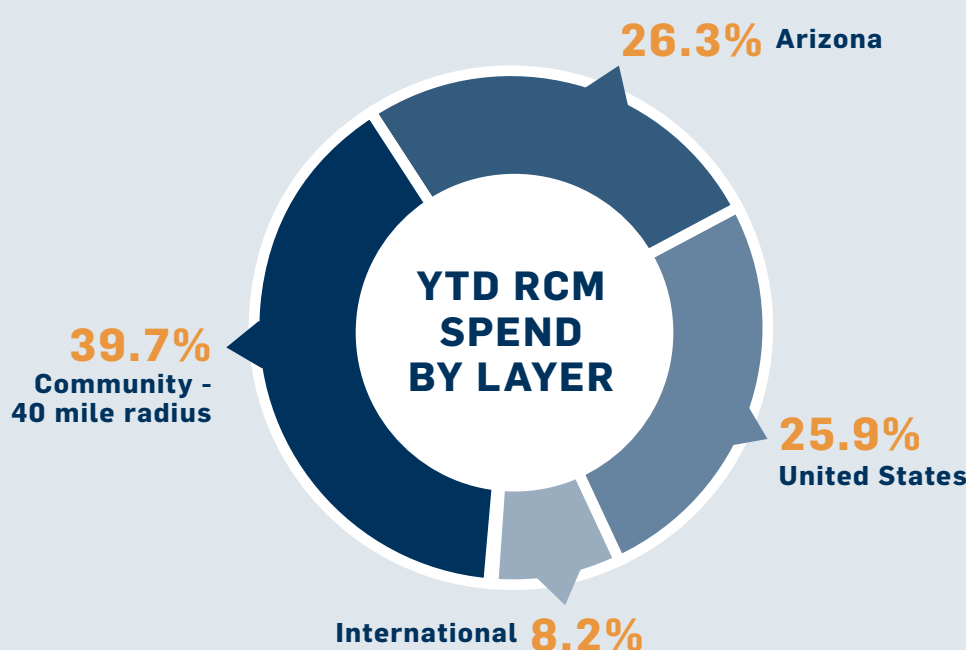

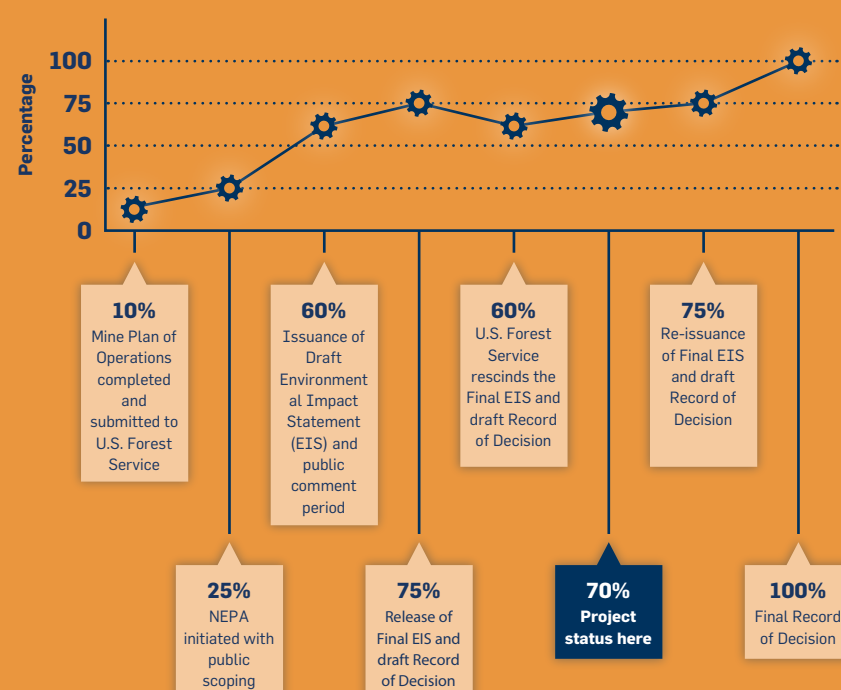


PERMITTING AND CULTURAL HERITAGE

Consultation on the Resolution Copper Project has been meaningful and consistent for over 11 years on terms defined by each consulting Tribe. So far, there have been over 550 documented consultations, as well as coordination and collaboration. As a result and to date, Native American Tribes have considerably influenced the project approach, from the relocation of facilities for the protection of specific traditional cultural properties, to the avoidance of medicinal plants, springs and ancestral sites for project activities. The consultation has also resulted in setting aside more than 800 acres of land and mineral title to protect and preserve Apache Leap, a site with deep cultural heritage and historical significance to local communities and the Western Apache people, including the San Carlos Apache Tribe, demonstrating that all feedback and consultations have led to important changes to the project plan. The decision by the US Department of Agriculture and the US Forest Service (USFS) to rescind the Final FEIS has allowed further consultation to take place. It is expected that additional consultation will take several months. In parallel, the Resolution Copper Project continues to engage and partner with local communities and Native American Tribes with ancestral ties to the project area.

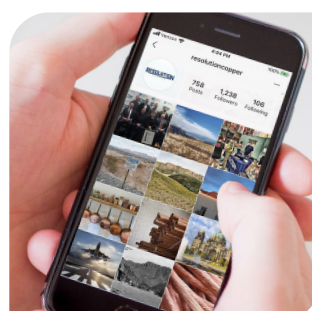
