
KEEPING OUR WORKFORCE SAFE

One way Resolution measures safety is by the All Injury Frequency Rate (AIFR), which tracks all reportable injuries; lost time injuries, restricted work injuries and medical treatment cases, per 200,000 hours worked.

Community Update: May 2022

Dear Neighbors,

I am grateful for the opportunities our towns and local communities have afforded us. So far this year, we have invested more than \$376,000 locally and taken great strides to encourage development in the area we call home.

The Town of Superior's purchase of the original Superior High School building is one of the many accomplishments we celebrated in the first quarter of this year. The former high school will now serve as a multi-generational center and hub for the community to come together. Resolution Copper is honored to have formed part of the many partners that rallied to make the Town's aspirations a reality.

I am proud to share that a primary focus this quarter was funding programs that directly benefit our children's future. For instance, Resolution Copper is honored to continue sponsoring the Globe High School Robotics team, which has supported the development of science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) skills and problem solving among diverse groups of students. Since its inception, the program has grown from five students to well over 200 and has seen over 25 program alumni go on to attend higher education in STEM related fields. The program now serves as a regional hub for robotics, with a standing agreement to support robotics in neighboring schools. But our efforts don't stop there.

As many of you know, our project has also supported the studies of hundreds of students through events supporting the completion of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the provision of the annual Resolution Copper Scholarship programs. Every year since 2002, we award students a grant to help alleviate the financial burden of pursuing higher education. I am honored to congratulate the recipients of the 2022 Resolution Copper Scholarships. I wish you the best of luck as you take this important step in your academic careers.

Like many of you, we prioritize the future of our younger generations, and a key part of that future is rooted in sports. Resolution Copper is a proud supporter of the Superior Little League and Native American Basketball Initiative (NABI) Foundation, where we've watched teams of young athletes thrive and grow.

I am also pleased to share the grand opening of the Riverside Ballpark baseball and softball field in White River, on the Fort Apache homeland. SUPERIOR, "A TOWN WITH A MINE, NOT A MINING TOWN"

The Town of Superior recently purchased the original Superior High School building as part of an impressive plan to develop a Multi-Generational Center. This historic landmark will house a new town hall, library, senior center, event center and the Superior Enterprise Center. Resolution Copper is a proud sponsor of this endeavor, which forms part of the Town's vision for economic diversification and community sustainability.

We look forward to continuing to support the Town's aspirations for growth and development for decades to come. In 2021, we signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Town to support the conveyance of hundreds of acres of U.S. Forest Service land as part of the land exchange. The land conveyance is part of the Southeast Arizona Land Exchange and Conservation Act, and would unlock many more benefits for the local community.

SUPPORT THE SUPERIOR CHAMBER OF COMMERCE

The Superior Chamber of Commerce, which is comprised entirely of volunteers, has taken significant strides in improving the quality of life in Superior. WE ARE COMMITTED TO TRANSPARENCY

In March 2009, we began our dewatering efforts to ensure our employees and contractors could work safely underground. The water we remove goes through a treatment process on-site and is then sent to farmers in the New Magma Irrigation and Drainage District (NMIDD) to grow crops, allowing ground water levels to rise in the area.

Resolution Copper has spent millions of dollars securing surface water and storing it as groundwater to provide water for our future operations. We have since stored enough surface water to sustain our operations for decades.


Soil Sampling

In Q1, we conducted quarterly soil sampling to monitor the impact of our dewatering activities. The goal of soil sampling is to ensure that irrigation of blended water does not adversely affect soil quality relative to pre-existing conditions. Our Environmental and Geology teams sampled over 70 fields in the NMIDD. We are proud to report that, to date, there have been no adverse effects to the soils or crops.

Water Sampling

The Community Working Group (CWG), its technical consultant Matrix, and Resolution Copper carried out quarterly water monitoring activities along Queen Creek and the Boyce Thompson Arboretum. Results comparisons are conducted annually in CWG meetings which are open to the public. The 2021 results were reviewed during the April CWG meeting and no exceedances to groundwater standards were identified. We are happy to share that no issues of concern were noted.

In addition to the monitoring work and in an effort to address the lingering impacts of historic mining, Resolution Copper has furthered its work with the Town of Superior to find ways to re-introduce water into Queen Creek.

CAREER EXPO

Resolution Copper has recently re-branded the Career Expo mobile app, as part of a fruitful partnership with Pinal Alliance for Economic Growth to introduce high school students across the region to a variety of career fields. The app proved especially useful at the heights of the COVID-19 pandemic, where virtual measures took effect amid limited inperson interactions. The app hosts virtual interviews, scholarship opportunities and college readiness tools.

FIRST ROBOTICS ARIZONA REGIONAL COMPETITION

The Globe Unified School District (USD) Robotics team demonstrated their talent and problem-solving skills in the FIRST Robotics Arizona Regional Competition, where they conducted live demonstrations of their latest robot. The exceptional group of students performed extremely well under pressure during the first in-person competition in over two years.

Resolution Copper has partnered with the Globe USD since 2014 to support the robotics program as part of our ongoing efforts to promote STEM education in the region. The program's popularity has grown substantially among the students and sparked their interest in pursuing higher education.

VACCINATION CLINIC

We recognize the effect COVID-19 has had on our community and collective well-being. In addition to continuing to support our ongoing relief efforts, and with support from Oddonetto Construction, Resolution Copper partnered with Cobre Valley Regional Medical Center (CVRMC) to sponsor a free COVID-19 vaccine drive-through at the Superior Cobre Valley Clinic. Over 40 eligible local residents received their first, second, or booster shots to protect themselves and others against the virus.
