Dear Friends & Neighbors,

It was an honor to be officially named President and General Manager of Resolution Copper this spring, after more than a decade of working closely with so many of you in support of this project. It is hard to put into words how much this community means to me, both professionally and personally. The Copper Triangle is a special place and home to extraordinary people with a bright future ahead.

I want to reiterate my commitment to responsible development and operations. We have made major changes to the project design in response to public feedback, including setting aside lands to protect Apache Leap, preserving public access to the Oak Flat campground, maintaining public access to the Legends of Superior Trail and rock climbing in Queen Creek Canyon, and implementing an innovative and uniquely effective Tribal Monitor Program.

I am particularly proud of the important progress we have made around water use and conservation, something that is top of mind for all of us who live in the area.

Importantly, Resolution Copper will be the most water-efficient mine in Arizona. At maximum operations, we'll use less than five gallons of water per pound of copper, compared to the approximately 10-50 gallons of water per pound of copper produced in other copper mines.

Resolution Copper will be underground and will use the latest technology proven at our scale to increase recycling and reduce water use. The water we remove from bedrock working 7,000 feet underground goes through an on-site treatment process and is then sent to an irrigation district where farmers use it to grow crops. Since 2009, we have provided more than six billion gallons of water to local farmers, which means more water remains in the ground for future use.

We have invested in an extensive surface and groundwater monitoring network and established a community monitoring program, where water samples are taken quarterly from locations surrounding the project and sent to an independent lab for analysis. The results are then shared with a community working group for review.

Recently, we signed a new partnership agreement with Rebuild Superior to fund the Superior Enterprise Center with \$50,000. This funding supports the rehabilitation of the electrical systems at the workforce development center. To date, Resolution Copper has donated over \$1.3M to the Superior Enterprise project.

By working together, we can protect the Copper Triangle's unique environment and cultural heritage while still creating new economic opportunities. At Resolution Copper, we are deeply invested in this community's future and committed to maintaining an open dialogue with all stakeholders to ensure the project moves forward responsibly and sustainably.

Together, we can put Arizona's resources and workers at the center of the nation's clean energy transformation.

The Superior Enterprise Center serves as a transformative catalyst to diversify Superior's economy through business services, workforce training, and entrepreneurship; all while enriching the community through engagement, education, and opportunity.

Resolution Copper is a proud partner to this hub of connectivity and learning, as our project and the community prepares for our future workforce and the economic diversification of the region. Since 2019, Resolution Copper has invested \$1.29M in the development and advancement of the Superior Enterprise Center. Exciting progress is being made as we move towards the first official program out of the old Superior High School campus, with welding expected to open later this year. Other planned activities include business launch camps, entrepreneurship development, computer refurbishment through AZ StRUT, workforce development programming, and much more.


