NO. 9 SHAFT GALLOWAY SINKING

We are thrilled to announce the successful completion of the No. 9 Shaft Sinking Galloway project, bringing the shaft up to 2024 standards for Resolution Copper, Rio Tinto, and Redpath. This project involved critical structural and electrical upgrades, including the removal of three decks and the installation of a state-of-the-art electrical system.

Our dedicated crews worked tirelessly, spending 24,481 manhours rehabilitating structural components and installing new equipment. Special recognition goes to Matt Brumen, Ricky Curtis, Dave Rockwood, and Calvin Georgeoff. The success of this project exemplifies outstanding teamwork and collaboration across our teams.

NO. 10 SHAFT NEW MINI WORK DECK

At Resolution Copper, we're always pushing the boundaries of innovation. Introducing the Mini Work Deck—a 20-foot marvel that's transforming No. 10 Shaft operations! Gone are the days of lengthy installations and delays. Our new deck covers 360 degrees, complete with an observation platform and water tank. It's light enough for easy installation and a hybrid wonder between a personal bucket and traditional work deck.

Big shoutout to AJ Quiroz and his crew, our engineering team led by Bobby Crab and Charles DiNolfi, and our partners at Cementation and Titan, who made this game-changing innovation a reality!


